Mission Director's message



DMI mission in Zambia, since 2008 have been supporting women in rural and semi-urban areas to form their community institution – known as self-help group (SHG), save small amount, take and repay loan, meet regularly and enhance their capacities. During this year, 4500 women SHG members were supported by DMI. I am happy

to state that about 60 % of loan amount was used for investment in small businesses which in turn have increased the income of members. DMI will continue to support members to increase their income and living standards.

DMI promoted women SHG members to start and expand their vegetable garden using low-cost drip irrigation method. This irrigation method of using bucket and rubber-hose has assisted 250 members to cultivate vegetables allyear and earn sustained income.

DMI organized vocational training for 180 youth members in four trades in its Lusaka and Chipata Vocational School and majority of the trainees have taken up employment or have started own business.

I thank the DMI members, staff and volunteers whose commitment and dedication has supported the realization of the mission and values of DMI Global mission. My thanks to the leaders and management of the DMI Trust and college in Zambia for their continuous support to the development work. Special thanks to all donors and supporters of the Zambia mission whose support assisted to implement the programs and realize lasting impact on the lives of women and youth.

Thanks to Fr. JE Arulraj, Founder, Sr. Lalitha, Superior general and Sr.Viyagammal, Provincial for their guidance and support to strengthen the Zambia mission.

DMI works with the people of Zambia to uplift the living standards of marginalized women, children, and young people for a better future. Our programs strengthened women' groups and farmer groups to improve and sustain their income and living standards.

DMI supported 4500 families, from 40 rural and semi-urban villages through the implementation of various developmental programs. This report informs the key activities implemented and the achievements in 2023.

Women empowerment program

During the year 2023, DMI mobilized marginalized women members from Eastern, Central and Lusaka provinces (Chibombo, Lusaka, Chipata, Chipangali, Ka tete, Kasenegwa, Mambwe, and Vubwi Districts) to form twenty-one women self-help groups and become members of federations for their development.

Women members have participated in various capacity-building trainings to initiate economic activities and increase their household income.

The activities conducted and its results are mentioned below:

- Conducted 195 group meetings for 1995 women members to regularize their meeting, record minutes, renew government issued certificates and initiate economic activities
- Improved the knowledge of 1900 women members in the Self-Help Group concept
- Strengthened capacities of 376 women group members on time management, leadership, book-keeping, income generation and entrepreneurial skills
- 1400 women members from 105 groups have participated in business development training.
- 60 women members have initiated micro-businesses- poultry, food services, vegetable/fruits vending, petty shops etc.

- Village Banking Scheme (VBS) was insisted among the women group members to come together, share their knowledge and improve their savings.
- Women members saved 250,000 ZMK (10,869 USD) through with Self Help Group Method (SHG).
- Two of the DMI group received ZMW 40,000 as a grant from government and they started poultry as a group business.
- Every year group will save the money after six months they will share out the money but many group managed to save more than ZMK 83,785
- Drip irrigation in 47 adapted demo plots of DMI women group in Chipata was initiated. And now 750 people are cultivating Tomato, sweet potato, cassava, green pepper and eggplant etc.
- Women groups are involved in various economic activities such as gardening, rabbit-rearing, Bee-keeping, saloon, petty shop, vegetable shop, catering, brick-making, pot-making, handicraft, piggery, poultry, goat-rearing, photocopy shop, butchery shop, sausage making, grocery and bakery. Almost 3500 women are involved in business.
- 26 federations are doing different types of group businesses like sausage making, hammer milling, village chicken farm, door-mat making and photocopy shop, poultry, and crop and vegetable cultivation.

Youth development program

Vocational training in tailoring, catering, cosmetology, and basic computer skills support the vulnerable rural youth to acquire a job with decent income and support their families. This vocational education is designed to make youths work-ready upon certification.

- During 2023, 86 youths have been equipped with four vocational trainings.
- 65 youths have been successfully awarded their respective vocational skill certificates.

• Youth have learned to develop other skills such as humility, respect for elders, self-control, teamwork, determination, problem-solving skills, time management skills, communication skills, negotiation skills, and interpersonal skills besides vocational training.

Child development program

Child development program covers children parliament and education support activities. These two activities help children to address the issues of school drop-out, child marriage, child trafficking, child labour and sexual exploitation.

- 50 children have become members in two children parliaments
- Children have learnt about Zambia parliament system, roles and functions of ministers and adopted the knowledge and practice of parliament in their groups
- 45 children have improved academic performance and extra-curricular skills through tuition centers. - Children have started practicing their leadership skills and guiding other children to continue their formal education

Community health program

DMI conducts health education activities in communities leading to their improved health status and well-being of individuals. The education focusses on prevention of diseases by practicing hygiene and methods and also taking up remedial actions when affected by diseases.

• 2358 community members are aware of the importance of health and hygiene.

Mr. William from Spain visited DMI women in Chipata on 10th to 11th Sep, 2023, interacted with women sex workers and observed the demo plots of agriculture farming promoted using low-cost drip-irrigation system.

Meeting the Mayor of Chipata

On 24thAugust, 2023, DMI along with ZEC officials met the Mayor of Chipata and requested support for DMI promoted women groups to market their agriculture and other production.











Success story

Woman increases her household income, savings and send her children to school



Ms. Rebecca, a 35 years old woman is now happy to see her life transformed through DMI initiatives and human-centered approaches. She lost her husband after a few years of marriage, and as a result, her life had become difficult for survival. She joined DMI-SHG in 2014, undergone various trainings and received loan

from the national bank to start a business. She raised her income and also her savings; and from her income she started supporting her children to continue schooling. In 2020 the ZEC came with the new project of climatesmart economic empowerment, a simple way of irrigating vegetable garden by using low-cost drip irrigation. She is happy and thankful to DMI. She encourages other women to venture into new business for their sustainable life.
